

## Larry C. Romjue, PGA 1938-2019



It is with heavy hearts that the family of Larry C. Romjue, PGA a PGA Member for over 40 years announces his passing. Huskers.com also has a story that went out a couple of days ago but the below was something that his son, Chip Romjue wanted to share with all of you.

Larry C. Romjue was born November 9, 1938 in Marshalltown IA and died on April 16, 2019 in Lincoln NE. Larry graduated from Nebraska City High School in 1956. He attended the University of Nebraska graduating with a BS/BA in 1960. While at Nebraska,

Romjue was president of Beta Theta Pi fraternity, a member of multiple academic honor societies and the varsity golf team. Larry joined the ROTC program and after graduating, continued his military service as an Army officer until 1965. While stationed in Williamsburg VA from 1960 to 1963, he played some competitive and team golf with Orville Moody.

Larry's life passion was golf. He lettered 3 times in college and eventually coached the Nebraska women's golf team (1975-1979) and the Nebraska men's golf team (1970 to 2001). He was known by many in the golf community as a gentleman and an intense competitor. He was a lifetime member of the PGA of America and won multiple Nebraska PGA section tournaments and awards including the 1980 Nebraska PGA Player of the Year, 1984 Nebraska PGA Professional of the Year and 1987 Nebraska PGA Match Play Championship. He qualified for the National Club Pro Championship and Senior Club Pro Championship several times and was a participant in the 1991 Senior PGA Championship at PGA National.

He was the head golf professional at The Knolls Country Club in Lincoln during two stints from the 1970's into the 1990's. Under Larry's leadership, the golf membership and golf schedule grew exponentially. He supervised the development of many young golfers who progressed from beginners to college caliber players. During the mid 1980's he took over the role of head professional at Seward Country Club for three years after the previous manager abruptly left SCC in debt to multiple top line golf club/apparel companies. After restoring the credit lines of the club and confidence of the local members, Larry returned to The Knolls to complete his PGA career.

Some of Romjue's family members followed his path into competitive golf. His son Chip represented Nebraska in the PGA Junior National tournament and Insurance Youth Classic in 1981 before playing for Nebraska Wesleyan during his college years. Larry's grandson Trevor Romjue was a top 10 individual finisher as a member of the 2009 Nebraska State High School Championship golf team. Granddaughters Madison and Brooke Romjue both competed for their high school golf teams. Madison continued her golf career in college and played a key role as Missouri Western advanced to the 2016 NCAA Division II National Championship tournament for the first time in school history.

# Rules Update with Tom Hearn, PGA

As most of you are aware by now, beginning January 1st of this year, the USGA introduced a new set of Rules with wide sweeping changes to the old code. As expected, there have been certain situations that have come up the past several months that have led to necessary tweaks to these new Rules along with explanations about certain items.



Knowing that this “finetuning” will probably be a necessity for a while, the USGA plans on updating and distributing these clarifications on a quarterly basis. The following is a list of the most major updates that were made available last week:

1. There is now a new Model Local Rule (G-9) has now been made available by the USGA that deals with the replacement of a club that is broken or significantly damaged. It is recommended that this new Model Local Rule be implemented at all courses and at all levels of competition. Click [HERE](#) to view this new Model Local Rule.

2. Because of concerns over a player being penalized for playing from a wrong place due to confusion regarding the new procedure for “Back-on-the-Line Relief” when taking relief from a penalty area, unplayable lie or relief from an abnormal ground condition in a bunker, the USGA has created a new Model Local Rule (E-12) to minimize this possibility. It is recommended that this new Model Local Rule be implemented at all courses and at all levels of competition. Click [HERE](#) to view this new Model Local Rule.

3. The USGA has issued a statement adding an additional update to previously issued clarification of Rule 10.2b(4) (Restriction on Caddie Standing Behind Player). Click [HERE](#) to view this statement.

4. There is now a revised answer to Question #12 on the previously issued FAQ list relating to Interpretation 4.3a/1 which limits the use of Greens Reading Materials. Click [HERE](#) to view this revised answer.

# Augusta National Women's Amateur was the stuff of dreams

AUGUSTA, Ga. — Before the week of the Master's, Amanda Doherty had only seen Augusta National once. It was Sunday, April 11th, 2010. That day Phil Mickelson won his third green jacket. Amanda was with her dad, Mike, and a friend of his.

It goes without saying, but Augusta National wasn't hosting women's tournaments back then. The club had not even admitted a single female member. But Mike Doherty's buddy had a hunch. "He said, 'You know, the next time I'm here, I'm gonna be watching Amanda play,'" Mike recalled Saturday afternoon. But back then he quickly discarded the idea. Yeah, right.

On Saturday, nine years removed, the prophecy has been realized. And it wasn't just that Amanda competed in the Augusta National Women's Amateur. Her golf-crazy father carried her bag. And yes, his buddy was in the crowd.

This Augusta National really is the place of dreams — it's all anyone wants to talk about. Perhaps that was the idea all along.

"I don't think I fully got it until I actually stepped on the Augusta's ground. I was like, 'This is real. It's pretty real,'" said Sofia Anokhina, the lowest-ranked am in the field. On Tuesday evening, Anokhina, who is Russian, rode in a quiet van filled with Italian players. The vehicle turned onto Magnolia Lane. "I heard the adjectives they were using, but very quietly," she said. "I was just like, 'No. You guys can say it out loud! It's gorgeous.'"

An event photographer snapped a pic of Anokhina in the moment. Encyclopedia Britannica could use it for "dreams realized."





Anokhina and Doherty were two of 10 women who advanced to Saturday's final round through an 11-for-10 playoff for the final spots. At five over with just 18 holes to play, were they going to chase down Jennifer Kupcho, who eventu-

ally reached 10 under Sunday, four clear of the field? No. But few people were completely locked in to the scoreboards at Augusta National Saturday.

As Doherty, Anokhina and the other competitors finished their rounds, with the event they've looked forward to for months finally closing, a train of high-fives awaited them. Right behind the 18th green was a line of four little girls, their right arms reaching out over the ropes far as they could stretch. Opposite them was another group of future women amateurs.

Back near the clubhouse was Kinley Brazell. She's an 8-year-old golfer, and she very eagerly told a reporter she'll be nine in just 11 days. Kinley was with her father, Kevin, from nearby Columbia, S.C. Her dad sported a newly purchased Augusta National backpack. Tucked into one of its pockets was an Augusta National teddy bear, price tag still affixed. Kinley was seeing Augusta National for the first time. She clutched a yellow Augusta National Women's Amateur flag while looking to score autographs from all 30 competitors. "They can sign anywhere on the flag but right here," she said, motioning to the bottom right corner. "That's where we're putting our tickets." In her mind, the flag is already framed and hanging on the wall.

## **Pinnacle Bank Championship Qualifier Returns to ArborLinks This June**

*Nebraskans invited to compete for spot in Web.com Tour Stop*

Omaha, Neb. – Golfers with Nebraska ties will have the opportunity to earn a spot in the PGA TOUR's 2019 Web.com Tour Pinnacle Bank Championship and compete for a share of the \$600,000 purse.

The 36-hole qualifier returns to ArborLinks in Nebraska City on Thursday, June 27, 2019. Professional and amateur golfers with Nebraska ties can vie for an exemption into Nebraska's only Web.com Tour event, the 2019 Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Heartland Chevy Dealers and hosted at The Club at Indian Creek.

"We anticipate a competitive field of Nebraska golfers and look forward to providing one player with a chance to play with some of the best on the Web.com Tour," said Jessica Brabec, Pinnacle Bank Championship Tournament Director. "We hope our fans come support the winner of the qualifier at our event held at The Club at Indian Creek this July 18-21."

Any professional or amateur with a 4.0 handicap index or less with Nebraska ties will be eligible to compete. Current legal residents of Nebraska, Nebraska Section PGA Members and PGA Associates, students and graduates of Nebraska colleges or universities and individuals born in Nebraska and graduated from a Nebraska high school are eligible.

The qualifier at ArborLinks is limited to the first 60 entrants who meet all eligibility and handicap requirements. Entry deadline is Friday, June 21 at 5:00 p.m. Complete details are available by visiting the tournament website at [The Pinnacle Bank Championship](#) or the [Nebraska PGA](#).

"Last year the Nebraska Qualifier came down to the last hole and featured arguably one of the best young amateur golfers in Nebraska history in Luke Kluver and Web.com Tour member Brandon Crick," said David Honnens, CEO of the Nebraska Section PGA.

"It's a great opportunity for Nebraskans," said Kluver, who beat Crick, a three-year Web.com Tour veteran, by one stroke to win last year's qualifier. "I want to thank the Nebraska Section PGA and Pinnacle Bank for giving me a chance to achieve my dream of playing professional golf."

The event features a purse of \$600,000 and was awarded the 2018 Web.com Tour's Truck Award and 2017 Web.com Tour's Tournament Rookie of the Year Award in its inaugural year. The 2017 champion, Sam Ryder went on to compete in the PGA TOUR, following in the footsteps of previous winners of the Web.com Tour's Omaha event, including Bo Van Pelt, Johnson Wagner, Heath Slocum and Jason Gore. The 2018 champion, David Skinnis, is currently 88 on the Web.com Tour money list. The tournament's charity partner, TeamMates Mentoring Program, receives proceeds from the event to help fund education and mentoring programs for Nebraska youth. In 2018, that donation totaled \$40,000, bringing the tournament's total charitable contribution amount to over \$140,000 since its inception.


## ABOUT THE NEBRASKA GOLF ASSOCIATION





At Happy Hollow Club, I was given the opportunity to perform many job duties. For the last few years, I was largely in charge of Men's Club tournament operations, especially building and operating the tournaments in Golf Genius, as well as handicap and tournament handicap management. Last year also brought me my third year of overseeing the Men's League, The Gaggle. We are very proud of the fact that this was the third consecutive year we were able to live score and be paperless.

I had worked on the technological side of the golf shop for a few years and last year I added Textron GPS to my list which included maintaining the golf side of the website, the Foretees App, as well as social media. 



However, I found the business of golf to provide me everything I was looking for and a career I am still happy to look back to as it was the right thing to do...Let's be promoters of our business by preaching the good things about the business of golf rather than be the ones tearing it down.

D) **Confidence and Confidentiality in All Areas** – Our goal is to build confidence and trust as we navigate our Careers, Employment and other areas of discussions. One of the hardest tasks the Career Consultants have is to maintain the levels of confidence and trust, but we cannot do our mission effectively if we do not keep privacy at its highest levels. Yes, we sometimes know of someone planning to leave a position, but we are never allowed to disclose that type of information. Please help us respect the wishes of each PGA Member by not asking the uncomfortable questions. Everyone needs to understand these conversations are confidential no matter the content.

# Nebraska's flood damaged golf courses are slowly opening

Once the Platte River flood waters receded, PGA professionals Don Dravland and Pete Balerud were relieved.

Their golf courses were largely intact. No greens were damaged.

Dravland's course, Pines Country Club in Valley, opened its back nine last week to member-only play. Balerud's North Bend Golf Course isn't open yet, needing to get its irrigation system running to wash debris from the course.

Oakland Golf Club, which was flooded by Logan Creek for the second time in less than a year, could get its back nine open in a week or two.

The Nebraska course hit the hardest is Quail Run, the municipally owned 18-hole facility in Columbus along the Loup River.

"Nothing has been done at this point," course pro Doug Dunbar wrote in an email, "as FEMA and the city's insurance company cannot assess the extent of the damage until the ice melts.

As of Wednesday, April 3rd, ice flows 5 feet thick still covered six holes on the south side of the dike, according to the Quail Run Facebook page.

Other courses that reported flooding included those in Niobrara, Neligh, Pender, Spalding, South Sioux City (Covington and South Ridge), York, Ord, Battle Creek (Evergreen Hill), Schuyler and Omaha (Knolls).

At the Pines, Dravland said several holes in the middle of the front nine received the most damage. The par-3 seventh hole is closed indefinitely as the course turns bunkers into grass moguls. The par-4 sixth, along old U.S. 275 (Reichmuth Road), was covered with mud along the left side and it might have to be temporarily shortened to a par-3.

He said he couldn't believe the debris left on the front nine, "billions of corn stalks, cobs and husks. And there's a lot who drink a lot of Fireball (cinnamon whiskey) from the bottles we've found."

The only greens with any damage were those for practice putting and chipping near the clubhouse, which itself was on dry ground. Of the two cart barns, the newer one had a lot of debris, but the original next to the practice range was dry.

Dravland and his wife, Lori, moved back recently to their home at the Pines. Their house had several inches of water in the basement. Mike Ten Eyck, the club's other pro, had 3 feet in his basement but was able to return home sooner.

At North Bend, the most damage was connected to the par-3 second hole. Some of the bank leading to the green eroded and the cart path has washed out. Another cart path between the 17th and 18th holes needed repairing.

Balerud said he hopes the course can open by the end of April. Seven holes he considers playable, but they are split between the two nines and away from the irrigation lakes that run west to east.

While two greens went under water, none were damaged. Balerud said only one ice chunk was found. The clubhouse was not flooded, nor were the cart shed and maintenance building, though members helped move the fleet of new carts to higher ground.

“As odd as it sounds, I’m happy with what we found,” he said. “I had envisioned the second green being washed away.”

Oakland continues its cleanup.

“We have moved corn stalks, pushed silt, washed off greens, removed debris, pushed more silt, cleaned out sheds, cleaned out equipment, moved even more silt, and are now working on turning our water on and assessing potential damages,” read a statement on the course’s Facebook page.

“This flood has presented some similarities to last year and also has brought some very sticky and slimy challenges. We will continue to remove silt from the course and hope Mother Nature will help us in drying some of these areas out.

The Oakland club’s plan for reopening is for the back nine to open to walkers only while cartpaths are repaired. The front nine and range will take longer to get ready.

While Quail Run waits for inspection and possible reopening in April as a makeshift nine-hole course, the Nebraska School Activities Association had to move its Class B boys golf championship in May from there to Elks Country Club across town.

Van Berg, the city’s nine-hole course, also was flooded and closed for a time.

Niobrara’s nine-hole course winds through the streets of the old town site. Because of recurring flooding, the town moved to higher ground about 40 years ago.

Large ice chunks were still on the course a few weeks ago, from photos posted on Facebook, but volunteers helped with cleanup.

Nebraska Section PGA Executive Director David Honnens of Lincoln said the PGA of America’s Golf Relief and Assistance Fund can help golf industry personnel affected by the flooding.
